WHH staff take on the Giant Walk

Colleagues at Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals (WHH) took on a 42km challenge on Saturday 10 May to raise vital funds for WHH Charity.

The Giant Walk route stretched from Hale in Merseyside to Hale in Cheshire, taking in scenic views along the Mersey Estuary, Manchester Ship Canal and Bridgewater Canal and passing through Stockton Heath before ending at the Millennium Clock.

The Ophthalmology Department completed the walk in nine hours, raising more than £3,000 to help create a sensory garden outside their department at Warrington Hospital. The garden will be a calm and therapeutic space dedicated to the memory of their much-loved colleague Tracey Parry, who worked at the Trust for more than 25 years and was known for her warmth, dedication and support for patients with additional needs.

Ellis Clarke, ICU Matron, also took on the challenge and completed the route in ten hours. Ellis raised more than £650 for the Intensive Care Unit, helping to enhance facilities for patients.
